OUR STORY

Zenshuji will be marking its 119th years of serving our island's residents. We've had humble beginnings in a dusty little sugar plantation village at Wahiawa, Kauai, McBryde Sugar Company's Camp 2 and Camp 3. The temple served its Japanese immigrant community at a the turn of the century in 1899 when 500 contract laborers arrived that fall. For the next century, the temple, it's members, and the surrounding community evolved for over five generations, establishing a foothold in an island kingdom that become a territory of the U.S. and eventually becoming the 50th state in the Union. A remarkable journey of Americanization. Where does it lead us in the next century? We must continue this journey with our adopted, local, multi-cultural spirit to guide us. The tenets of Zen Buddhism remains constant. However this time, we embrace our kamaaina heritage, one that is of this land, of these islands, so we can flourish in this dynamic American culture.

New Year events

End of year, beginning of year, December-January is usually a busy time. This year there in no mochi making. The traditional **mochitsuki** has been cancelled again. We'll bring it back next year.

The New Year's eve **Ringing of the Bell** however, continues. It has not been publicized, but we have a group that bears this tradition. We meet at 11:30 pm, Dec 31st. We start ringing the bell 15-20 minutes before midnight, before the noisy firecrackers take over. The bell is rung 108 times. Check the website for the significance and meaning of that number. We then head to the kitchen to partake in **oden**, a one-pot dish, served with several ingredients such as boiled eggs, daikon, fishcakes stewed in a light broth. You are welcomed to join us. A New Year's **Blessing Service** is usually held at Buddhist temples. Either on the eve or on New Year's day. While there is lots of merry making and celebration elsewhere at this time, the mood is peaceful and quiet at the temple. Maintaining a Legacy

One of the challenges moving ahead is to maintain the legacy of our parents and grandparents who built this temple. It is now our kuleana to maintain, upkeep and preserve what was bestowed to us for future generations.

Two major challenges face us. The roofs of our temple and social hall are in need of repairs. There are major leaks in the social hall. The temple roof leak is currently being assessed.

Other areas of the social hall need to be upgraded, a functioning stage, an improved restroom facilities and accommodations to make it available for community use. Our certified kitchen has been an asset and could use further upgrades in equipment.

For support and assistance, we'll continue to reach out to our Zenshuji ohana, our supporters and the community.

In spite of the challenges, as we have faced with Covid, the lessons learned clarify and strengthens our resolve. Still we maintain an attitude of gratitutde.

We will host lectures, informal talks, quiet activities, exhibits, demonstrations, arts, crafts, music, song and dance. Tea, manju, senbei, and mochi will be available for snacks.
