- (4) Membership dues (if it slipped by you in January) dues supports our activities and events
- (5) Building fund fixing shoji doors, replace temple and hall roofs

Obon gives us an opportunity to say "Thank you" to those who gave us life. We should never forget that we exist because of our parents and the long line of ancestors who came before them. By lighting a candle and offering incense, we honor and extend our gratitude and hospitality to visiting spirits.

[2] 2025 The Chochin Project: Remember your loved ones forever

This project was started in 2008, to remember our loved ones. For a one-time donation of \$25.00, a **commemorative name tag** of your honoree will be attached to a chochin and strung around the temple during our Obon festival. Every year hereafter, a chochin with the name tag will adorn the temple, i.e. in perpetuity. The **chochin** (lantern) is an iconic symbol of Obon, lighting the way home for our ancestral spirits who return to join us in a celebration of dance and joy.
